- ▣ Globalization of trade and information exchange

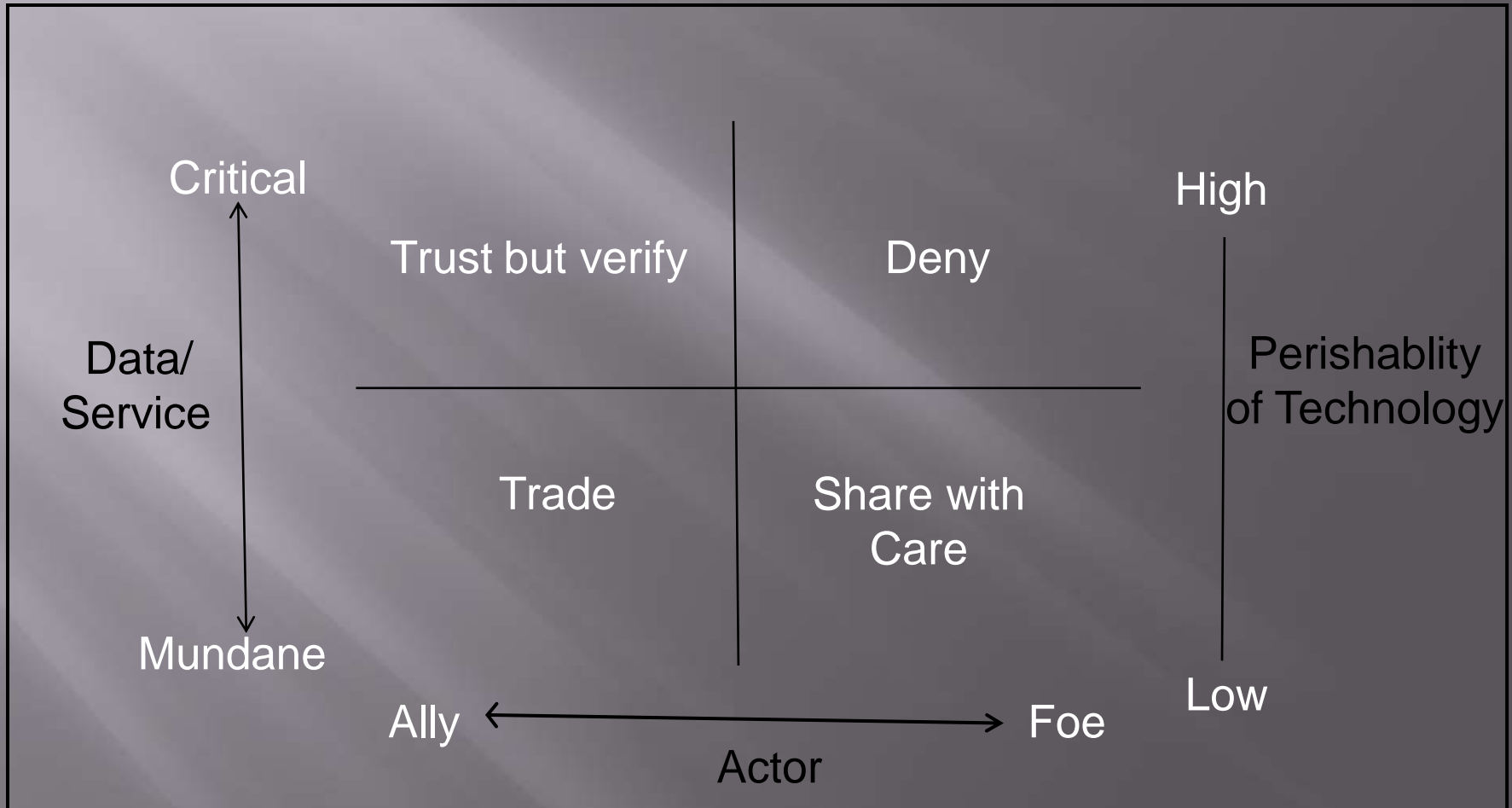
